

We are grateful to Dr. Shipra Dentist from Dental Hospital of PGIMER to visit DIR INDIA. She took a class on oral hygiene and dental care. Dr. Shipra assured that any adult or child suffering from dental issues in Janta Colony, she will personally help them.





MEDICAL TRAINING

The onset of summer begins and lasts until June and July followed by monsoons and humidity.

This is when India experiences its peak-summer with unbearable temperatures followed by humidity and wet climate. The humidity and temperatures are around 40-42 degrees Celsius.

With heavy rainfall, the drainage in Janta Colony slums overflows and the water seeps into the homes of Basti people.

In academics, water borne diseases like Malaria, Dengue, and Typhoid etc. are covered both in academic classes as well as committee meetings. Due to humidity, menstrual hygiene is extremely important.

The sultry weather and heat both generate skin diseases if not educated through committee meetings and CAP programs. Humidity causes rash and itching in the groin area and armpits.






NUTRITION TRAINING

In Monsoon the seasonal vegetables are bitter gourd, **bottle gourd, ash gourd, ridge gourd, snake gourd, and many other vegetables like cucumbers, tomatoes, beans, okra and radish**. All these vegetables are added in different gravies so that they are not visible to the child. The children do not enjoy eating vegetables. Different recipes are created to ensure the child enjoys a regular diet plan which aids to foster good health and immune activity.

This month's academic classes and committee meetings emphasized on diets related to the monsoon season and how it plays an important role in beating heat and building immunity.

Deficiency diseases kwashiorkor and marasmus were also covered.





NUTRITIONAL DEMONSTRATION

- Date of the Nutritional demonstration: 17th May 2022
- Name of the dish: mix lentil and fruit chat
- Chana chaat is simply a dish made with kala chana, luscious chutneys, veggies, fruits, coriander leaves and chaat masala.
- Nutritional value per serving :
 - Calories 150
 - Protein 5 gm.

- 2 children have lost weight due to diarrhea and fever
- 13 children have the same weight due to chest congestion and fever

CHILD ACTIVIST PROGRAM

This month 15 students participated in the Child Activist Programme (CAP) where a team of health promoters taught them about the importance of a balanced diet , safety and preventive measures in COVID19, and importance of vitamin A including its food sources. Different games and activities were also included in the programme like musical chair, kabaddi, kho-kho and Rubik cube puzzle.







HOMEOPATHIC CAMP

The Homeopathic Medical College and Hospital, Sector 26 Chandigarh, held 4 camps on every Wednesday in May 2022.

Team of 3 doctors and paramedical staff including Dispensary run an OPD. There is free consultation and free medication.

85 patients from Basti out of which,

- 7 were male and
- 69 were female and
- 9 were children

The ailments reported were:

- Arthritis
- Amenorrhea
- Skin ailments
- Ovarian cysts
- Gastric issues etc.







EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS:

• SCHOOL WITH A DIFFERENCE REPORT:

- ★ Total strength this month was 79 including 9 new admissions.
- ★ Enactus team distributed Colgate toothpaste amongst the children
- ★ Students of SWAD School participated in making Mother's day cards to show their love for their mothers.









• COMPUTER CLASSES:

Computer classes for young girls and boys of Janta Colony started in October 2021 with two students. The publicity of computer classes is spreading through word of mouth and today we have strength of nine students who are attending classes. Monthly fees for computer classes is Rs 500 per student per month. We

have a list of Basti girls who are keen to learn computer skills but due to financial constraints, keeps them restricted to grow in life.

In the month of May, the total strength of basti students was 5. Following topics were covered:

- Introduction of computers
- Understanding word processing
- Introduction to internet and web browsers
- Introduction to PPTs and spread sheets



• TUITION CLASSES:

Evening Tuition classes are held every day for Basti children as students need extra coaching and guidance with regards to cope up with the Public school standards. In the month of May, total strength of basti students for tuition classes were 5.
