To do so, the students of Swad School celebrated the 77th Independence Day by singing patriotic songs with full zeal and vigour. Some children showed their creative excellence by performing dances on the national song as well.



The INNER WHEEL CLUB (an NGO sponsored by WHO) visited DIR INDIA and distributed packed lunches cooked by Annapurna to 100 families on 16th August, 2023. The president and her colleagues were impressed by DIR's efforts, especially after witnessing English recitations of nursery rhymes and mental maths. The UKG children in the age group of 5 years to 6 years truly impressed the board and made DIR proud!









On 28th August 2023, Harshvardhan Jain and Meenakshi Jain sponsored a lavish lunch in honour of the 3rd birthday of their twin sons, Krishay and Kriday. The lunch was prepared by the DIR Team under the supervision of the nutritionists, for the school children, pregnant mothers, lactating mothers, malnourished children, and the entire DIR Team. MEDICAL TRAINING

In August, a lot of cases of eye flu were seen among the children. Many of our SWAD School children its victims.

In the medical education program, we conducted classes on eve flu and discussed its symptoms and preventive measures. In medical classes, we took a unique approach to inform teachers such as showing videos and involving photochromatic memory to help the the information staff remember permanently.

Various committee meetings were held in different parts of the neighbourhood to prevent its spread. Any SWAD School student who contracted eye flu was told not to come to school. The parents were given a prescription for treatment by Dr. Asha Katoch.



Dr. Asha also took classes on the menstrual cycle for our new staff, to make them understand the concept in a simple and comprehensible manner. In committee meetings, dengue and chikungunya were also discussed due to the rise in reported cases besides eye flu.

NUTRITION TRAINING

In the month of August, academic classes included the following topics:

- 1. Dietary management during menstruation
- 2. Nutrition during pregnancy
- 3. Nutritional requirements for lactating mothers

COMMITTEE MEETINGS

In committee meetings, Basti women were explained how to take care of their nutrition during menstruation, pregnancy, and lactation, with the help of a balanced diet, supplements, and regular monitoring of daily intake of nutrients.



NUTRITIONAL DEMONSTRATION

Demonstration on 22nd August 2023. Name of the Recipe - Nutritious Ragi Pakoda

2023 is celebrated as millets year. Millets are grains packed with protein, antioxidants, and numerous nutrients. They are also helpful in lowering blood pressure and cholesterol levels.

In August, the nutritional demonstration showed the preparation of ragi pakoda along with soya granules and green vegetables to enhance the nutritional value.

Nutritional value per serving - 100 gms approx.

- Energy 65 Kcal approx
- Protein 10 gm



STATISTICS OF CHILDREN **UNDER THE NIPP PROGRAM ADOPTED BY DONORS**

DETAILED PROGRESS REPORT OF NIPP

Total attendance for the month of August was 50, out of which 20 were underprivileged and malnourished children below 5 years of age, 4 were lactating mothers and 3 were malnourished needy women.

Out of 22 children, 8 children gained weight, 1 child lost weight due to polluted water supply in their respective area and 13 children showed no change in weight due to seasonal illness like cough and cold.





Children Not weighed in Dhanas and Janta colony








Total Pregnant women in Dhanas and Janta Colony
