MEDICAL TRAINING

Our Medical Education Programme is not only concerned with maternal and child health, but also with disease outbreaks. The Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India, reported six laboratory-confirmed Nipah virus cases, including two deaths, in Kozhikode district, Kerala, between September 12 to September 15, 2023.

Infection with the Nipah virus, a zoonotic disease And it is transmitted to people via contact with infected animals such as bats and pigs. There is no vaccine or medicine available. As a result, it is critical to raise public awareness about the virus.

So we took a medical class about the Nipah Virus and taught how to prevent it through committee meetings. Our medical team educates the Underprivileged community on preventive measures they can take.

In Addition to Revision Purpose, we also took classes about the menstrual cycle and pregnancy.

1. Benefits of prebiotic and probiotic food
2. Dietary management for malnourished pregnant women, gestational diabetic patients.
3. Nutritional requirements for malnourished lactating mothers.

Keeping the above points in mind , nutrition education was provided through committee meetings to the basti women, so that they can adopt a healthy lifestyle at their home.



NUTRITIONAL DEMONSTRATION

Demonstration on : 19th September 2023

Name of the Recipe - **Nutritious Barnyard Millet Kheer.**

The year 2023 is celebrated as Millets year. Millets are the grains packed with protein, antioxidants and numerous nutrients. They are also helpful in lowering blood pressure and cholesterol levels.

In the month of September, Barnyard millet kheer (*Swang ke Chawal ki Kheer*) was prepared under the nutritional demonstration. Dry fruits were also added in the kheer to enhance its palatability as well as nutritional value. This millet is a good source of iron, zinc, protein and fiber and is easily digestible.

Nutritional value per serving - 100 gms approx.

Energy 100 Kcal approx

Protein - 8 gm

DETAILED PROGRESS REPORT OF NIPP:

Total attendance for the month of September was 44 out of which 20 underprivileged and malnourished children below 5 years of age, 2 Lactating, 2 Pregnant mothers and 3 are malnourished needy women.

Out of 20 children, 10 children gained weight where they live and 10 children showed no change in weight due to seasonal illness like cough and cold.



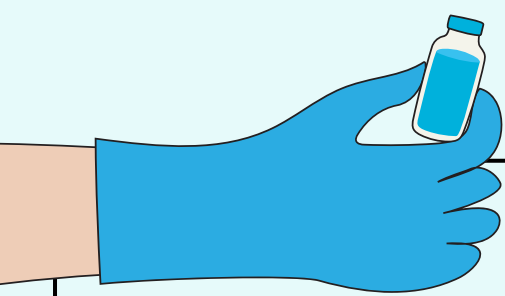

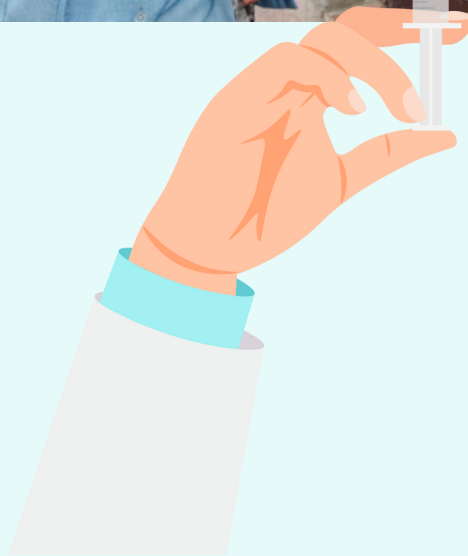

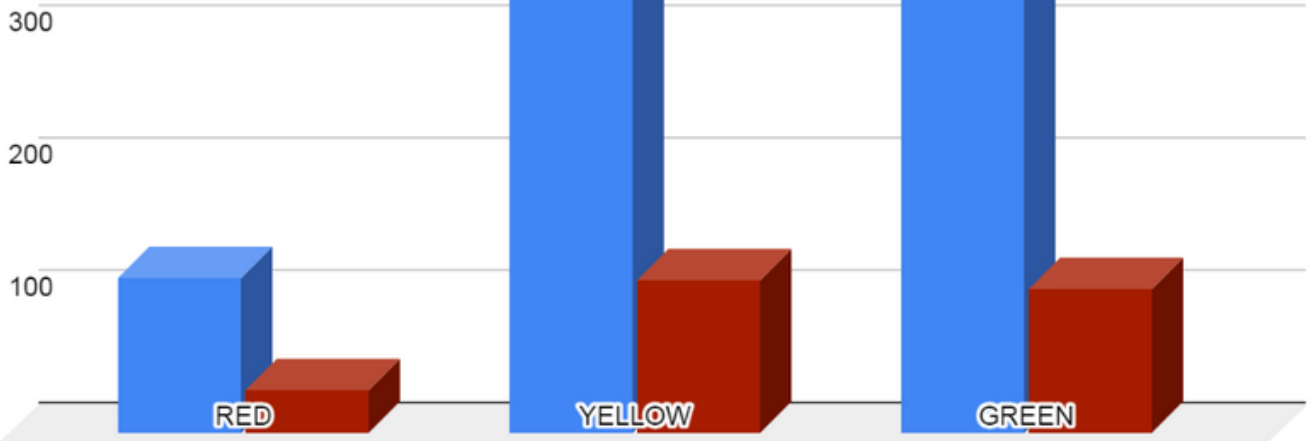

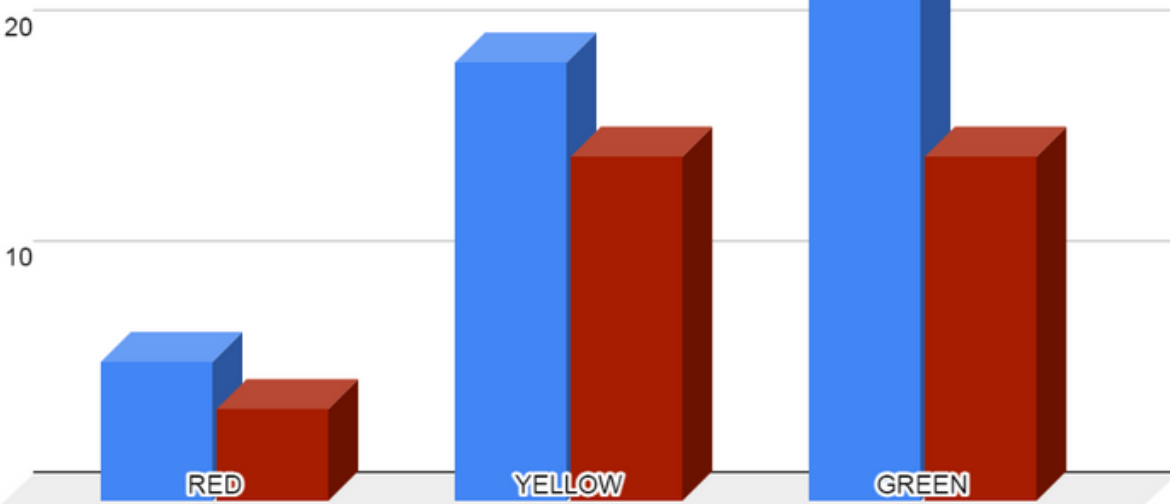

Children Not weighed in Dhanas and Janta colony

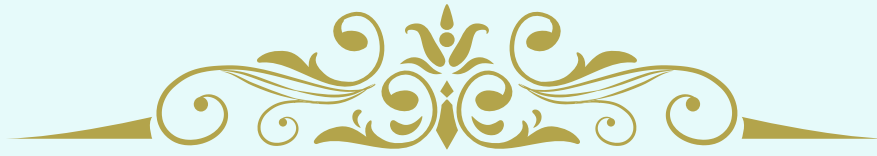

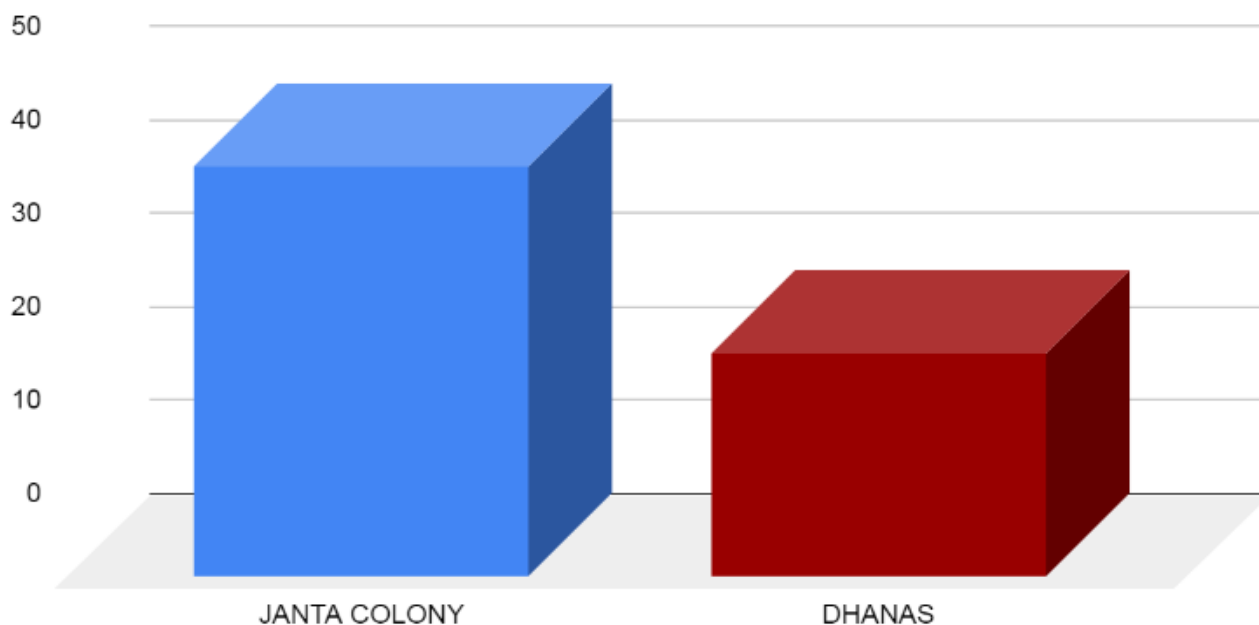

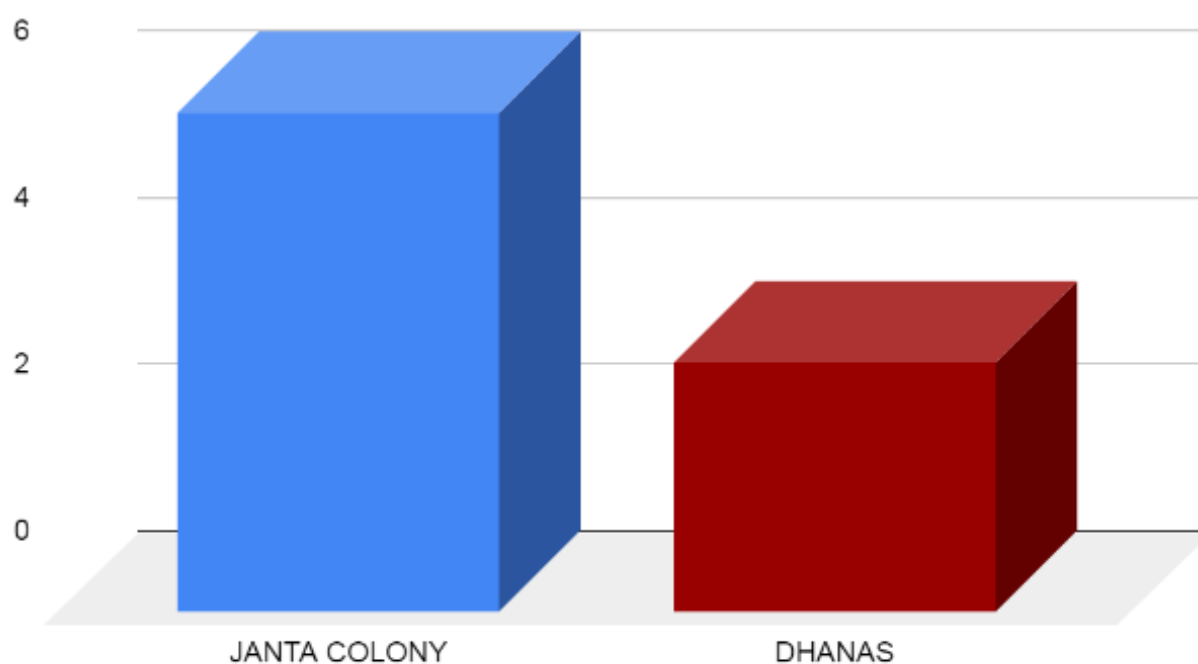

Homoeopathy camp organised by Homoeopathic Medical College and Hospital of Sector 26, Chandigarh.

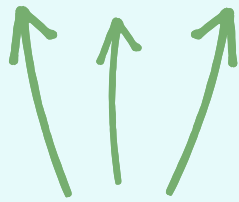
Team of 2 Doctors and Paramedical staff comes twice a month, every alternate Wednesdays to serve the community with free consultation and free medication.

Teachers Day was celebrated amongst SWAD teachers and the Medical team on 5th September.



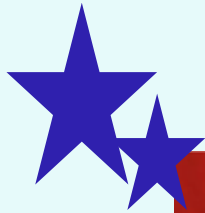
Shri Krishna Janamashtmi was celebrated by SWAD school children along with the entire staff of DIR India. Best Fancy dress students were selected for awards.
