The new General Manager Of State Bank Of India Mr. Himanshu Garg along with staff visited DIR. The briefing was done by Teachers. They had a good interaction with children. They were fascinated with the performance and discipline of the children. The briefing of the medical program was done by the field coordinators and Health Promoters.









The staff, Ms Reeta and Ms Sujata along with 7 students from Oakridge International School Mohali visited the DIR Office. The students had a good interactive session with SWAD children. The visitors were amazed with the standard of their performance. They admired the discipline and were highly impressed by the confidence of each child. The school donated books, stationary and work books.









MEDICAL TRAINING

Topics Assigned

The medical education was mostly on lungs as in December the major issues were Pneumonia, Upper Respiratory Tract infection (URTI), Bronchitis, and all the topics covered in Medical Training were Tuberculosis as well as anatomy of lungs.

Despite being a preventable and curable disease, every year about 10 million(https://www.who.int/health-topics/tuberculosis) people fall ill with TB and 1.5 million people die from TB each year which makes it the world's top infectious killer disease. Moreover, it is the leading cause of death in HIV infected patients.

Our CEO, Dr. Asha Katoch took a class on TB in which the cause of TB, its types, symptoms, diagnostic methods and its treatment was elaborated very well. Tuberculosis cases are there in Janta Colony. Due to ignorance, Families keep this disease secretive as the fear and phobia still exists amongst ignorant families. The DIR medical team conducts committee meetings more often to educate the families that this disease is curable. The treatment is for six months and it is free of cost by the Indian Government.





NUTRITION TRAINING

The Medical Project takes care of maternal and child health. In this program, nutrition plays an important role. In addition, we also guide the people on the type of diet for various other ailments like hypertension, tuberculosis, diabetes and Ischemic Heart Diseases. Four Committee meetings are held by each Health Promoter in a month, through which seasonal and chronic diseases are explained to Basti people in a simple and local language. Malnutrition is a major problem amongst most of the residents.

Keeping in mind the above facts the topics covered in academics in the month of December are:

- Clinical assessment of malnutrition
- Dietary management during Tuberculosis.
- Evaluation of malnutrition





NUTRITIONAL DEMONSTRATION

Nutritional Demonstration on 12th Dec. 2023

Name of the Recipe - Nutritious chidwa namkeen

Flattened rice or chidwa or poha is easily digestible. It is a good source of calcium, iron, folate and energy. To make chaat more nutritious other ingredients added were peanut (dry roasted), chana dal (deep fried), bengal gram (roasted), kishmish and curry leaves. This namkeen is good in taste and flavour and low in cost.

Nutritional value per serving - 100g

Energy - 80 Kcal

Protein - 7.5g








- Activities, children learnt paper craft, they made paper flowers and they made flowers and stars and with pencil waste.
























